

## Monthly Summary Report of February,2022

### I Financial Position of States

The month of February, 2022 saw an upward trend in the States' monthly fiscal assets as compared to January, 2022. The daily fiscal assets of the States at the end of the month of January, 2022 was Rs. 3,15,540.05 crore, whereas at the end of the month of February, 2022 the daily fiscal assets of the States was Rs. 4,43,853.42 crore.

During February, 2022, a total of Rs. 2,378.68 crore was released as Additional Central Assistance for Externally Aided Projects (EAPs) to States as per the details given in the table below:

### **Consent of Open Market Borrowing (OMB) and Negotiated Loan allowed to the States:**

Department of Expenditure, Ministry of Finance follows the fiscal limits inter-alia mandated by approved recommendations of Finance Commissions through the powers to approve borrowings by States under Article 293(3) of the Constitution of India.

During February, 2022, Gol consent of Rs. 22,625 crore was issued to States under Article 293(3) of the Constitution of India for raising Open Market Borrowing (OMB) for the remaining period of financial year 2021-22.

### **Capital Expenditure linked borrowing of 0.50% of the GSDP:**

The capital expenditure has a high multiplier effect, enhances the future productive capacity of the economy, and results in a higher rate of economic growth. Accordingly, out of the net borrowing ceiling (NBC) of 4% of GSDP for the States for 2021-22, 0.50 percent of GSDP was earmarked for the incremental capital expenditure to be incurred by the States during financial year 2021-22. For this a target for capital expenditure was fixed for each State. To become eligible for incremental borrowing, States were required to achieve at least 15 percent of the target set for 2021-22 by the end of 1<sup>st</sup> quarter of 2021-22, 45 percent by the end of 2<sup>nd</sup> quarter, 70 percent by the end of 3<sup>rd</sup> quarter and 100 percent by 31<sup>st</sup> March 2022.

After third round of review undertaken during February, 2022, Government of India consent of Rs. 13,744 crore was issued to 6 States under Article 293(3) of the Constitution of India for achieving the target for Capital expenditure.

**Additional Borrowing linked to performance in power sector:**

Ministry of Finance, based on the recommendations of the Fifteenth Finance Commission, has decided to grant additional borrowing space of upto 0.5 percent of the Gross State Domestic Product (GSDP) to the States every year for a four year period from 2021-22 to 2024-25 based on reform undertaken by the States in the Power Sector.

During February, 2022, additional borrowing permission of Rs. 1,593 crore was issued to Andhra Pradesh for undertaking the stipulated reforms in Power Sector.

During the month of February, 2022, as per the recommendations of the 15<sup>th</sup> Finance Commission, a total of Rs. 13140.60 crore was released to the States as per the details given in Table.

In addition, a sum of Rs. 1,47,348.01 crore was released by Department of Economic Affairs as share of Central taxes and duties to State during the month of February, 2022.

**Special Assistance to States for Capital Expenditure for 2021-22:**

Capital Expenditure amounting to Rs. 13,190.4466 crore has been approved for the States except for the State of Uttarakhand under the Scheme of 'Special Assistance to States for Capital Expenditure 2021-22' and an amount of Rs. 9,358.9316 crore has been released to the States up to the month of February, 2022. Further, out of Rs. 13,190.4466 crore approved amounts, Rs. 6408.5050 crore was released under Part I/II/III of the Scheme towards initial allocation and amount of Rs. 2950.42660 crore has been approved and released towards additional allocation under the Scheme.

The State Government of Madhya Pradesh has submitted a proposal for availing incentives provided for privatising State Public Sector Enterprises (SPSEs) under Part-III of the Scheme. After examining the proposal, an amount of Rs. 518.17 crore was approved as Special Assistance (Loan) to Madhya Pradesh under Part-III of the Scheme and the 1<sup>st</sup> instalment amounting to Rs. 259.085 crore has been released to the State.
