Subject: -Ban on revision of salary structures at any level - Posts in Public Undertakings.

The undersigned is directed to invite attention to this Ministry's Office Memorandum No.5(35)-E.III(A)/66 dated 29th August, 1966 (copy enclosed), the provisions of which have been extended till 30th June, 1968, and to say that it has been decided that the general policy decision contained therein that there should be no change in the structure of salaries at any level will also apply to the following categories of posts:-

- (a) Top posts in public undertakings categorised in Schedules 'A' to 'D' appended to Cabinet Secretariat O.M. No. 72/45/CF-65 dated the 13th October, 1965, as brought up-to-date in the Bureau of Public Enterprises O.M. No. 3(1)/67-F1 dated 6th March, 1967.
- (b) Other posts the creation of which or appointments to which require approval of the President/Central Government under the relevant Articles of Association/Statutes of the public undertakings concerned.
- Accordingly, Ministries/Departments are requested not to initiate or sponsor proposals involving upward revision of the scales of pay of the above categories of posts in public enterprises so long as the orders contained in the Office Memorandum dated 29th August, 1966 referred to above remain in force.

Copy of Office Memorandum No.F.5(35)-E.III(A)/66 dated the 29th August, 1966 from Ministry of Finance, Department of Expenditure addressed to all Ministries/Departments of the Government of India, etc.

The Mindersigned is directed to say that, as a measure of economy, it has been decided that there should be no change in the structure of salaries at any level for a year or two. Ministries/Departments are accordingly requested not to initiate proposals involving upward revision of the scales of pay prescribed for a class of posts or for individual posts.

The decision would also cover re-classification of existing posts if such re-classification involves increasing the pay without any increase in the duties and responsibilities of the post, and also cases where such increase is in the form of a special pay in lieu of a higher pay scale.

2. These orders will remain in force upto 30th June, 1967 and will be reviewed thereafter.
