
Subject:- Deputation of Central Government servants on foreign service with U.N. Bodies - Participation in the U.N. Pension Fund Scheme.

The undersigned is directed to invite a reference to this Ministry's O.M. No. F.1(16)-E.III(B)/66 dated 5.11.1966 in accordance with which officers of Central Services deputed on foreign service for a period exceeding 5 years with the U.N. Secretariat and other U.N. Bodies were allowed to join the U.N. Joint Staff Pension Fund as full members, subject to the conditions stipulated in the afore-said O.M. The question whether these orders can be made applicable to the cases of persons already on foreign service with U.N. Bodies on a tenure of 5 years or more on 5.11.1966, has been under consideration of Government.

The President is now pleased to decide that provisions of the orders dated 5.11.1966 may be made applicable to cases of persons referred to above with effect from the date from which they are admitted as full members of the U.N. Joint Staff Pension Fund. As the period of full membership under the U.N. Joint Staff Pension Fund will not count for pension under Government, the President has also been pleased to decide that the pension contributions, if any, paid by the officers concerned to the Government of India from the date of admission to full membership under the U.N. Joint Staff Pension Fund should be refunded to them.

In so far as the persons serving in the Indian Audit & Accounts Department are concerned, these orders have been issued in consultation with the Comptroller & Auditor General of India.
