OFFICE MEMORANDUM

Subject:- Issue of certificate under F.R.26(c) in the case of a quasi-permanent Government servant.


The undersigned is directed to refer to clause (c) of F.R.26 which provides that if a Government servant while officiating in a post or holding a temporary post on a time-scale of pay, is appointed to officiate in a higher post or to hold a higher temporary post, his officiating or temporary service in the higher post shall, if he is reappointed to the lower post or is appointed or reappointed to a lower post on the same time-scale of pay, count for increments in the time-scale applicable to such lower post to the extent it is certified that the Government servant would have officiated in the lower post but for his appointment to the higher post.

2. The President has been pleased to decide that the certificate prescribed in the above-mentioned Rule is not necessary in the case of quasi-permanent Government servants for the purpose of counting service in higher posts for increment

in the lower posts in which they have been declared quasi-permanent and that increments in such lower posts may be allowed, automatically.

3. In so far as Government servants who are serving in the Indian Audit and Accounts Department are concerned, these orders have been issued after consultation with the Comptroller & Auditor General.


