
I am directed to refer to this Ministry's letter of even number dated the 31st January 1962 on the subject mentioned above and to enclose herewith a copy of the Corrigendum No. 4(15)/58/D(MS) dated the 6th February 1962 issued by the Defence Ministry to their circular letter dated 23-12-59 on the subject. The amendments may be incorporated in the copy of that Ministry's letter of 23-12-59 and enclosures thereto forwarded along with the circular letter dated 31-1-62 of this Ministry referred to above.

2. I am also directed to say that the following items may be inserted as items 8 and 9 in Annexure I to the Defence Ministry's letter dated 23-12-59. These items were inadvertently omitted in the copy forwarded along with the letter dated 31-1-62 of this Ministry.

"8. When an officer's tenure of service is likely to be over, intimation should be sent to the Ministry of Defence at least three months in advance, to facilitate the issue of his posting orders. Ministry of Defence should also be informed whether a relief for the officer is required and if so what will be the terms and conditions of deputation for the relieving officer.

9. As soon as the officer on deputation rejoins duty in the Armed Forces, the Ministry of Defence will indicate the date of joining to the borrowing authorities who will then issue a formal gazette notification replacing the services of the officer at the disposal of the Ministry of Defence with effect from that date, i.e. the date on which the officer has joined his Unit. Two copies of that notification should be sent to the Ministry of Defence and a copy thereof endorsed to the Controller of Defence Accounts concerned."



Copy of Corrigendum No.F.4(15)-58/D(MS) dated the 6th February 1962 from the Ministry of Defence addressed to all State Governments and Administrations etc.

The following amendments are made to this Ministry's letter No.F.4(15)/58/4483/D(MS), dated the 23rd December 1959, as amended vide letter No. F.4(15)58/D(MS), dated the 16th August 1960 regarding the deputation of Service officers for Civil appointment - procedure:-

- i) Clause 'Medical Attendance' in Annexure II is re-constructed as under:-
" Such an army officer will be entitled to medical facilities to the same extent and at the same scale which he would have enjoyed under Army/ Navy/Air Force rules".
- ii) In line 4 of clause 'Service' in Annexure III delete - the word 'Leave etc.'
- iii) Add a new para 10 to Annexure 1.
" 10- The officers on deputation in civil employ irrespective of the fact whether they are entitled to medical entitlement under civil rules or military rules, would receive medical treatment in civil hospitals and from civil doctors."
- iv) In clauses headed 'Accommodation' in Annexure II & III add at the end the following:-
" Officers will be required to surrender Defence Pool accommodation, if any in their possession. In case the officers continue to retain the Defence accommodation, they will be treated as unauthorised occupants and recovery of rent will be regulated under para 14(b) of Q&R i.e. assessed rent or market rent, whichever is more will be recovered.

2. This letter issues with the concurrence of Ministry of Finance (Defence) vide their u.o. No. 19-PD dated the 12th January 1962.
